Single Building Restoration Program

The restoration of single buildings in 2010 was supported by a grant from Sida called "Job Creation through Conservation" (5 buildings) as well as private contributions of building owners (2 buildings). This year marked the completion of cycle IV of the Job Creation Project, which reached 12 communities in total throughout the West Bank and is estimated to have resulted in around 24,000 direct working days and 12,000 indirect ones.

Of the 7 restored buildings in 2010, 2 were fully subsidized by their owners to be reused as family houses; the other 5 were restored for public uses, contributing 5 more spaces that serve their communities and are open for cultural and social activities.

Single Building Restoration Program

These 5 newly restored centers increase the number of restored buildings for public use since 2002 to 65 and provide new spaces for community interaction, cultural activities, and networking in the West Bank.

Furthermore, Mr. Nassar Odeh from Al Taybeh and the Thaher family in Beitin contracted Riwaq to renovate their houses for their own private use, demonstrating an increasing interest among individuals to reuse these buildings for housing purposes.



Direct working Day

days are defined as those days registered on site on a daily basis by the site supervisor and signed by the worker himself; a working day i around 8 working hours. The average direct working day in Riwaq's projects cost around \$1.5 USD, meaning that every 103 USD spent in a restoration project will result, on average, in 2 direct working days and 1 indirect one.

Indirect working days are an estimate of working days needed off site to complete site related work such as wooden and iron works, tran portation, tile making, etc.

Urban Regeneration Program

Pilot: Birzeit

This year marked the fourth year of direct interaction and work with the community of Birzeit on the regeneration of the historic center. Regeneration is a multiflaceted, multiflisciplinary process that directly contributes to the social, economic and cultural development of the local community.

In addition to our projects and the interventions we have made in the historic center, this year was amazing in that the impact of our work became visible and tangible; people report higher satisfaction with their living emotionments, children have safer areas to play, new cultural activities are taking place and we have more friends and partners in the community.

Physical interventions

In 2010 we were able to spend about 160,000 USD from a generous grant given by Sida in addition to more than 30,000 USD given by the local community (the Municipality and Birzeit Pharmaceutical Company (BPC)) on physical interventions.

We continued with our preventive conservation and public space upgrading scheme, through which we have rebuilt fallen walls, upgraded facades and insulated buildings, installed new doors and windows, fixed building entrances, etc.

In cooperation with the Municipality we developed, designed and installed a signage system for streets and building numbers in the historic center. This was coupled with a number of activities for a greener Birselt: the Islamic cemetery was cleaned and re-planted with the help of BPC, the historic center was planted entriety through community donations and voluntary work, and we designed and implemented a public garden right next to AI Rozana Building.

Mutual Heritage: Investing Together

Mutual Heritage is a EuroMed Heritage 4 Project instituted in cooperation with Morocco, Tunisia, France and Italy. Entering its final year (of a 3 year cycle), the project's end product will be a heritage map and a heritage guide for 19th& 20th century architecture in the central highlands of Palestine.

2010 marked the second year in which Riwag organized an exhibition, training module and heritage trips as well as participated in workshops.

EXBITION: Interior Makeovers: Upgrading the Living Environment for Residents of Historic Buildings is an exhibition consisting of film and both shat has documents the rehabilitation of living spaces for 3 families residing along the heritage fattl. Whether organizing, coordinating or participating, Riwaq is committed to activities that promote and boost cultural heritage protection and development.

1. Site Trips:

What is the 4CHO Cooperation?
